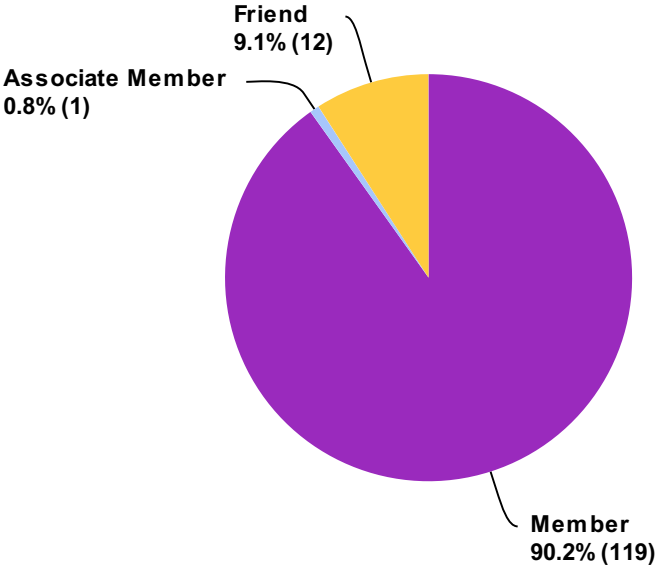


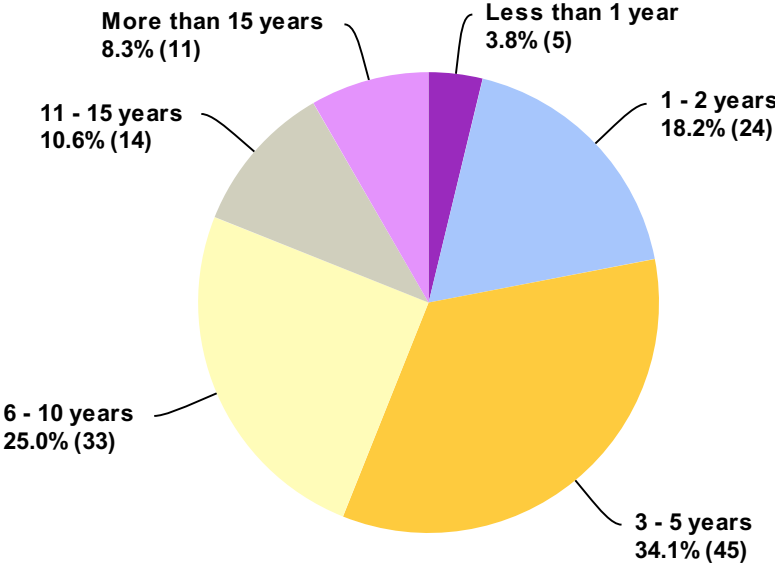

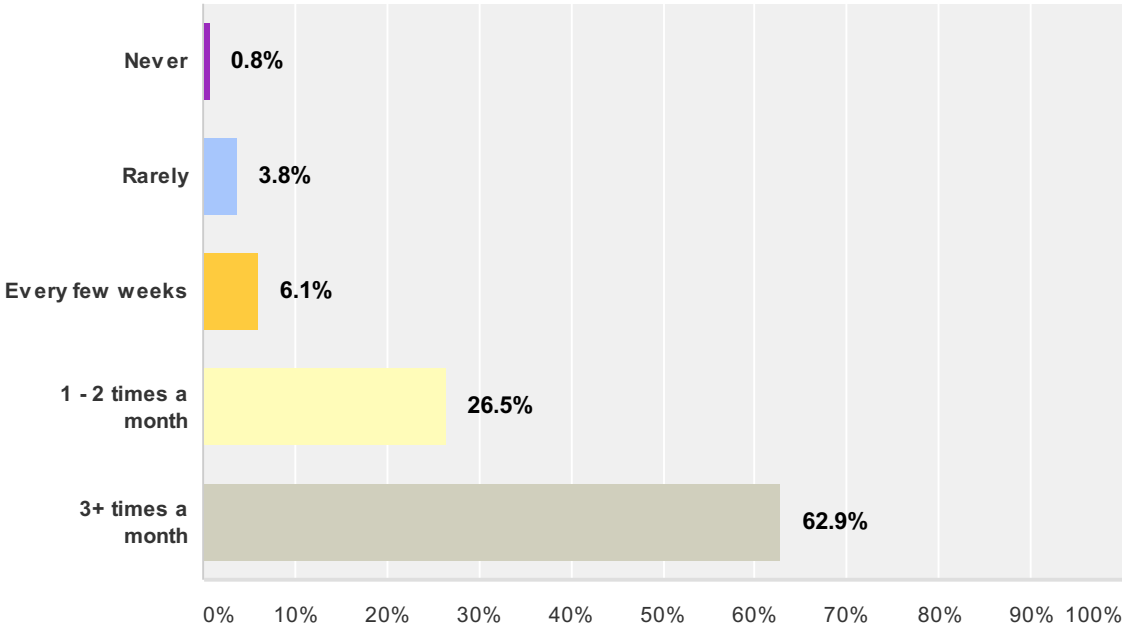
### Q2 How long have you been associated with the congregation?

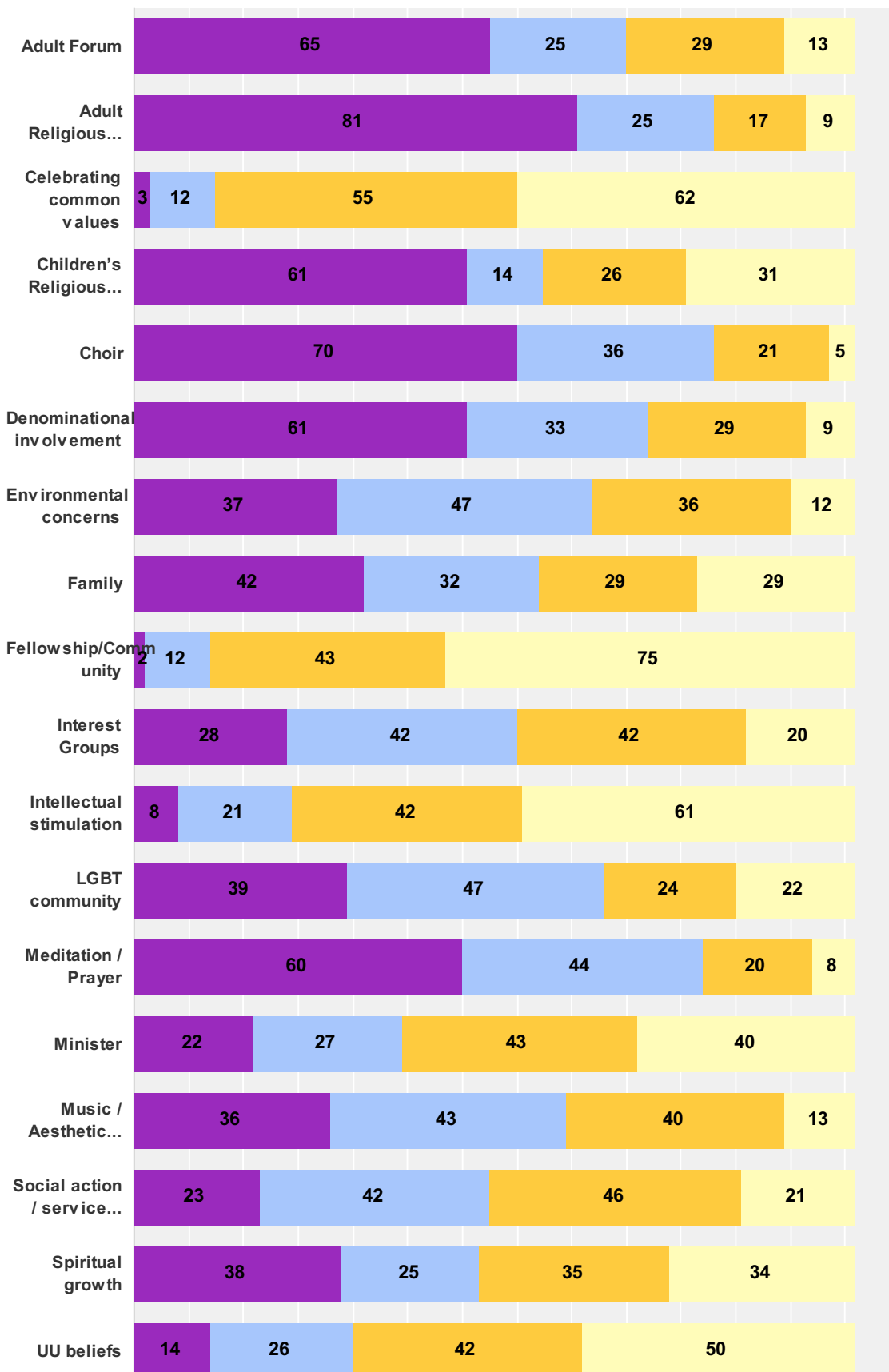
**Q3 During the last 12 months, approximately how often have you come to WUUC on Sunday mornings?**

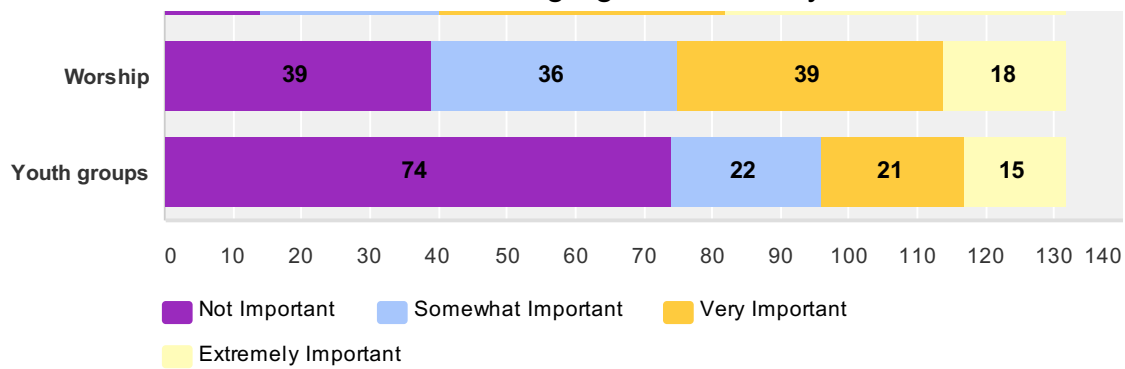


**Q4 Please rate the importance of the following in why you FIRST attended WUUC:**

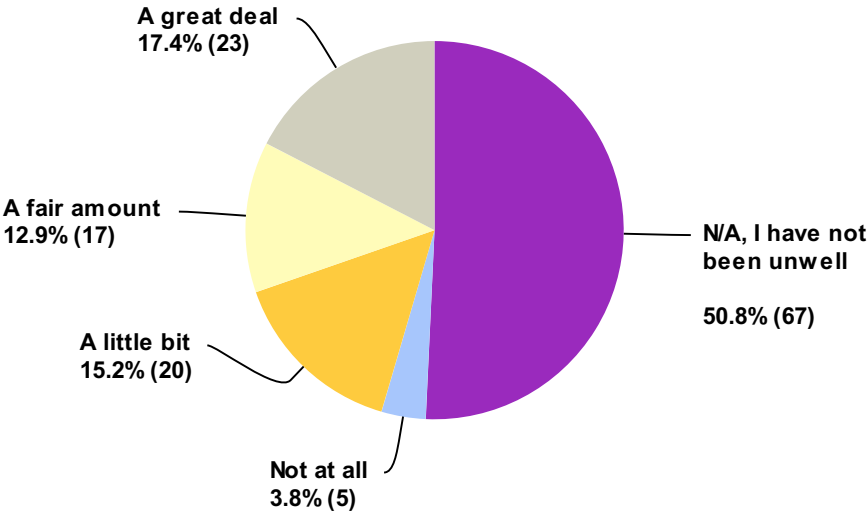
**Q9 How much is your affiliation with WUUC and/or Unitarian Universalism a source of strength or comfort to you?**

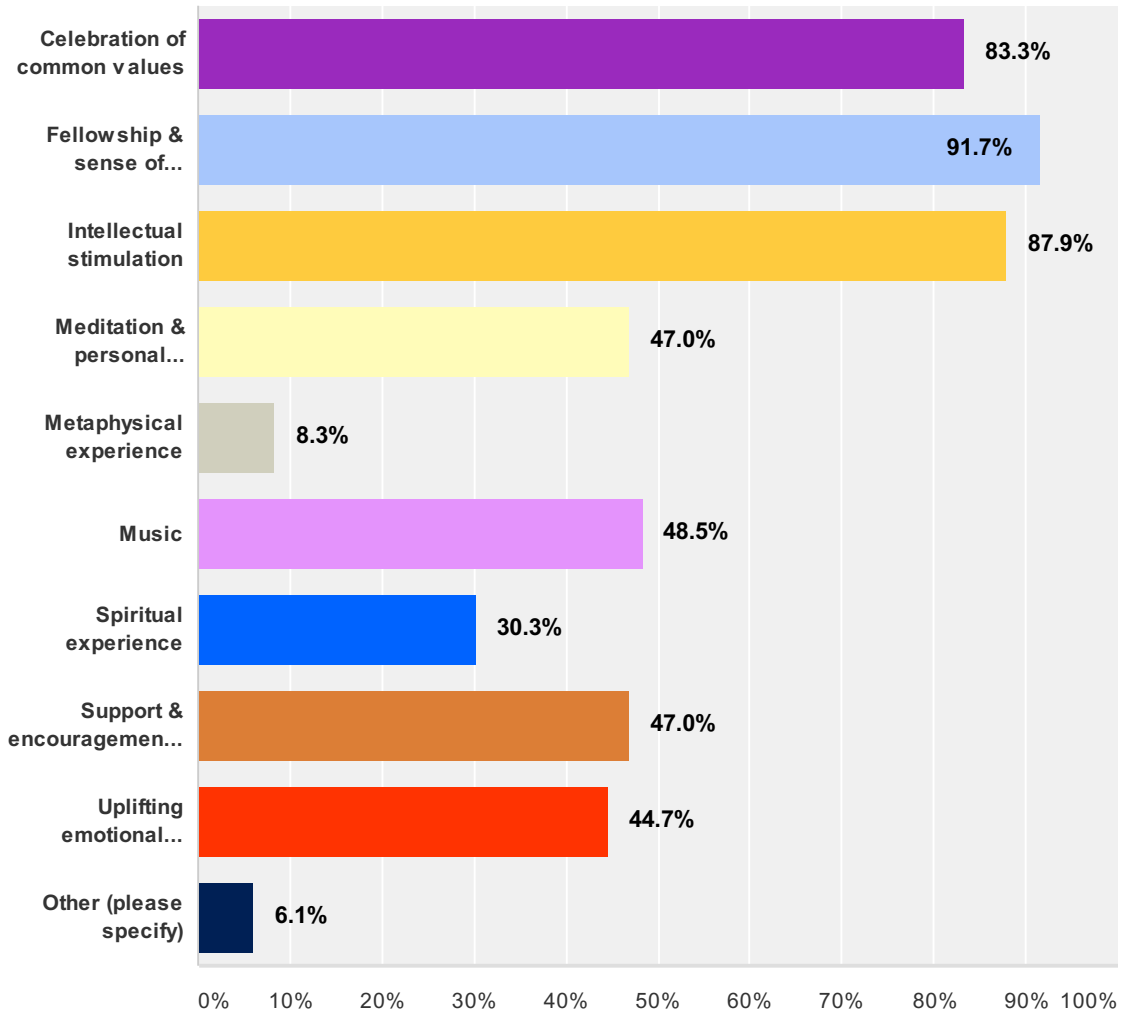
**Q10 Thinking back to a time when you have been unwell, to what extent did the congregation reach out and offer support to you?**

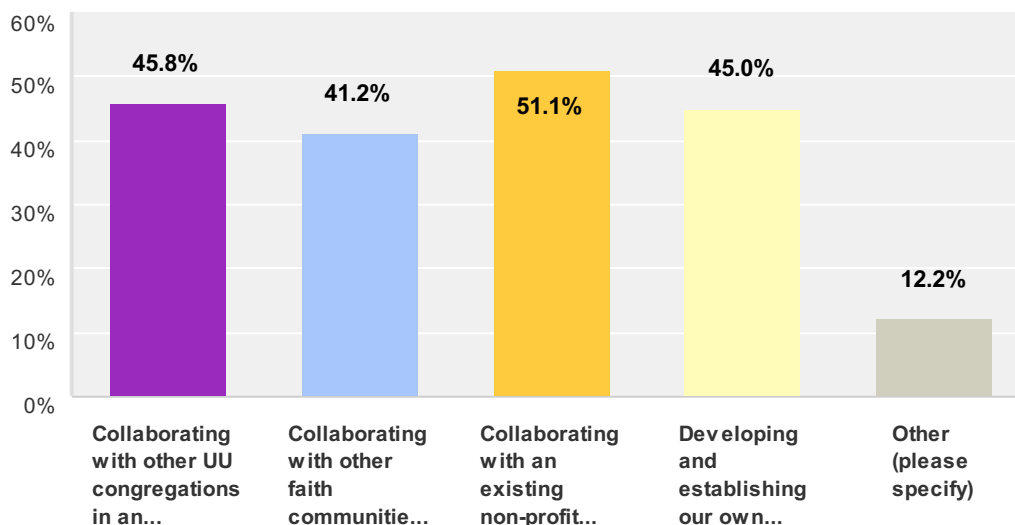

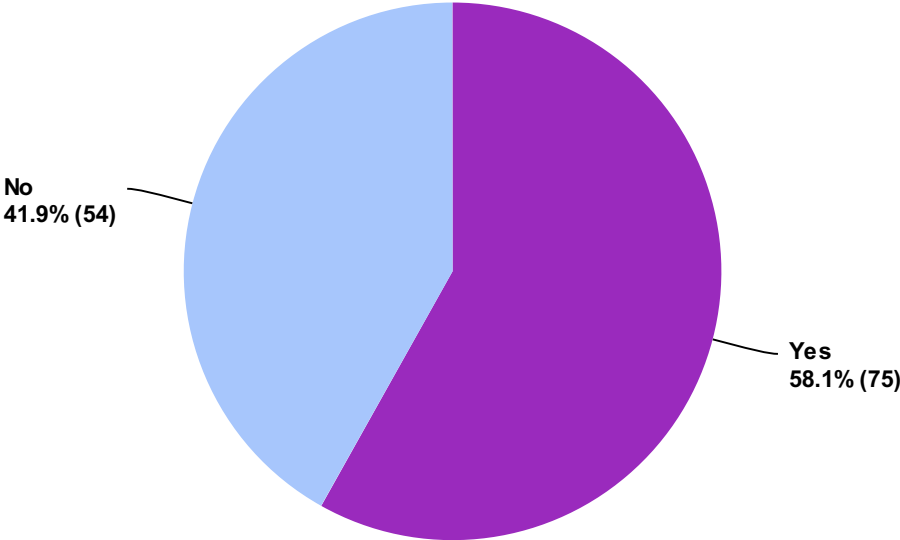
**Q22 Are you aware of the WUUC endowment fund?**

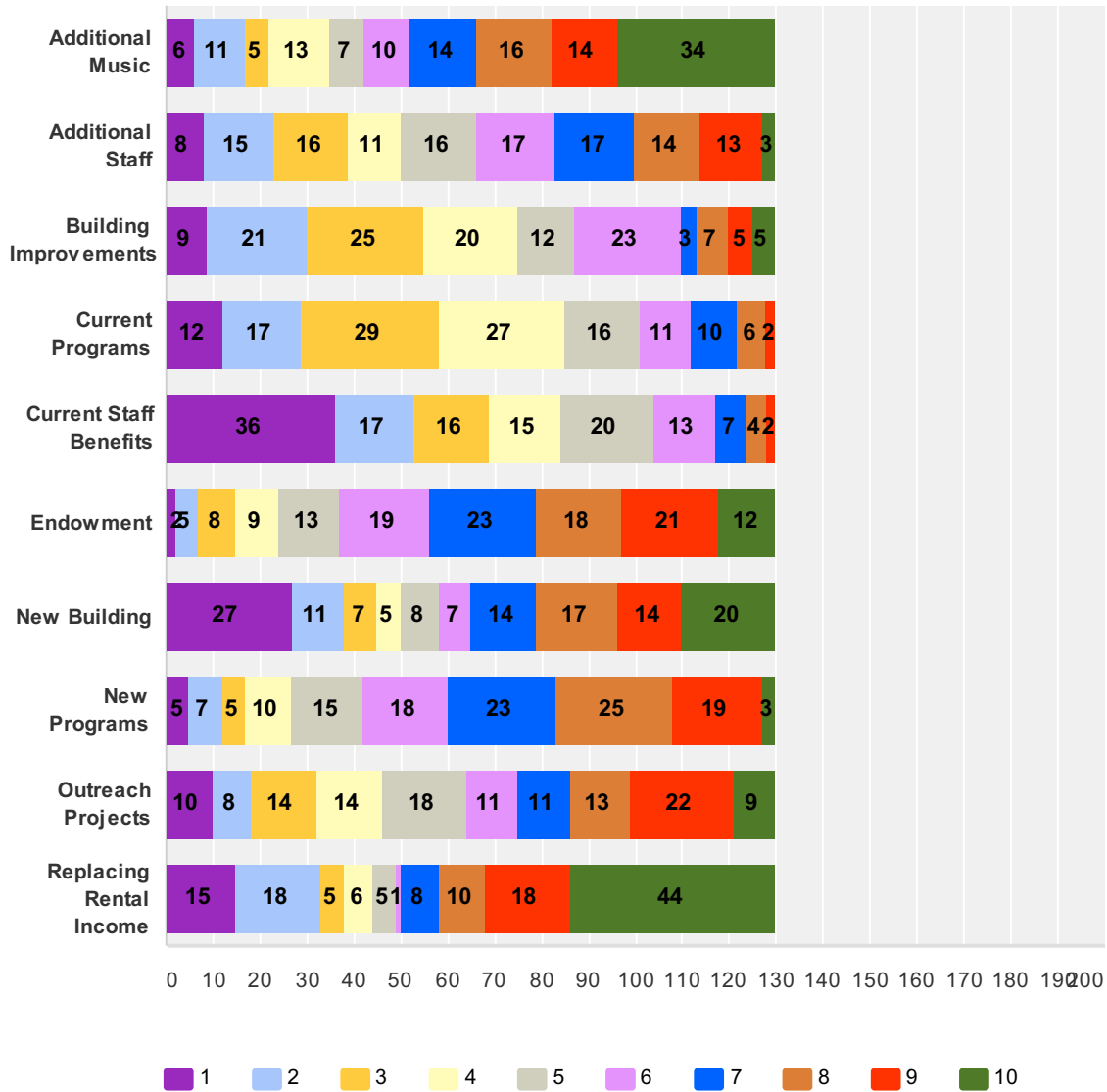
**Q23 Are you aware of the retirement and estate planning that can be done via the UUA that can provide gifts to the congregation as well as income for your retirement and/or heirs?**

### Q35 How important to you are these Sunday service objectives?

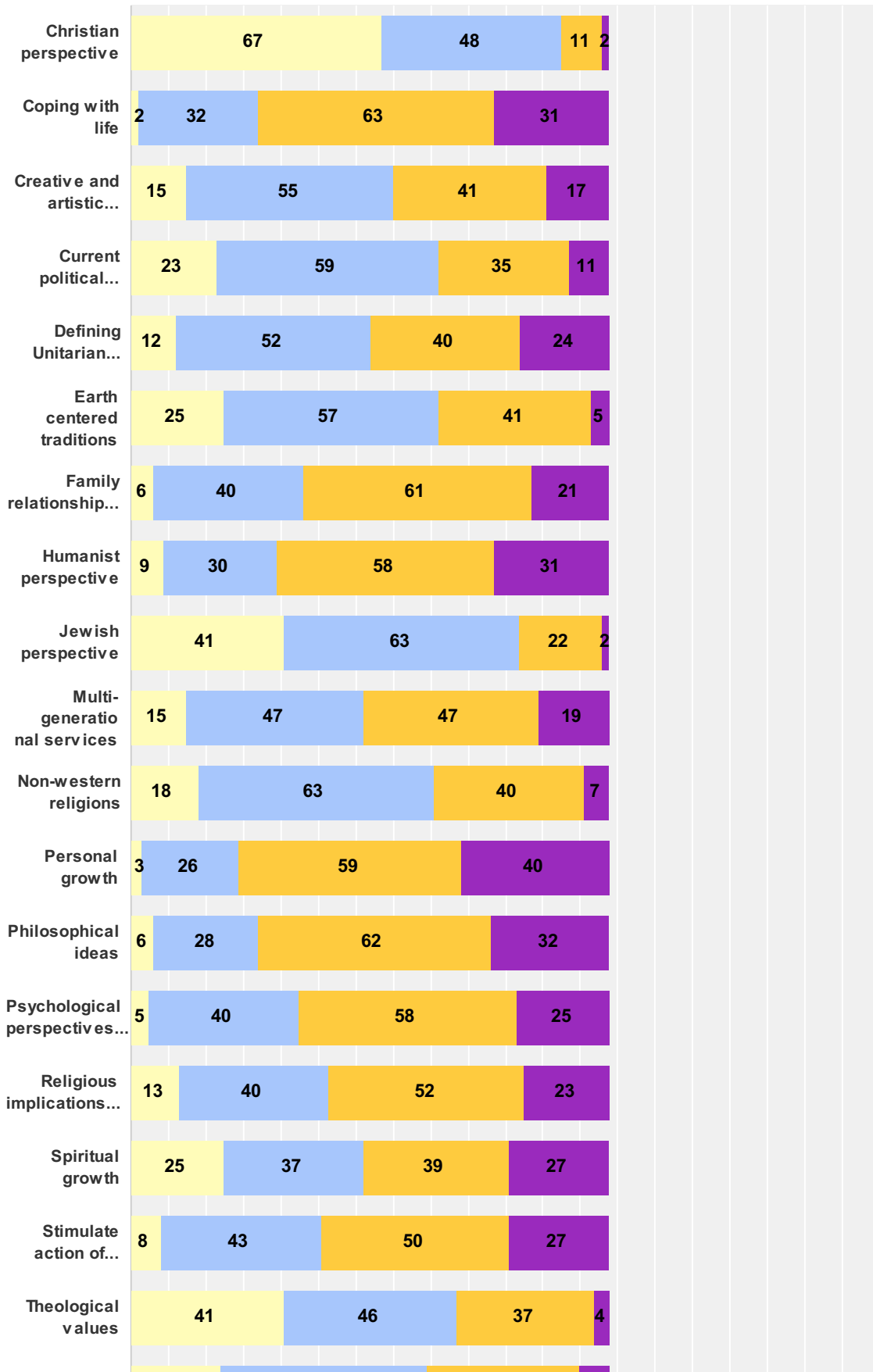

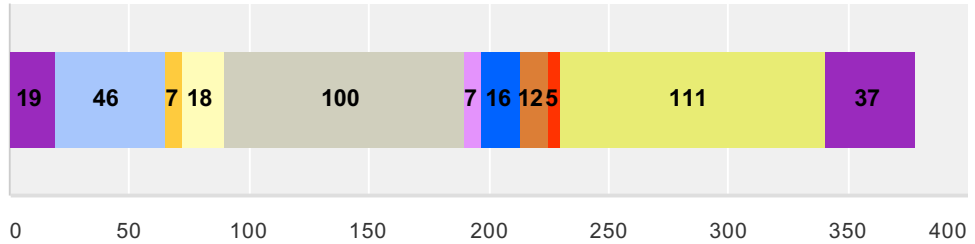

**Q40 ...which of the following priorities for the church's settled minister do you consider to be the most important? (Please select 3)**

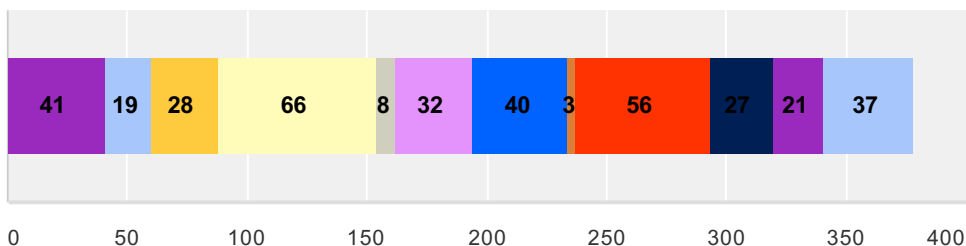

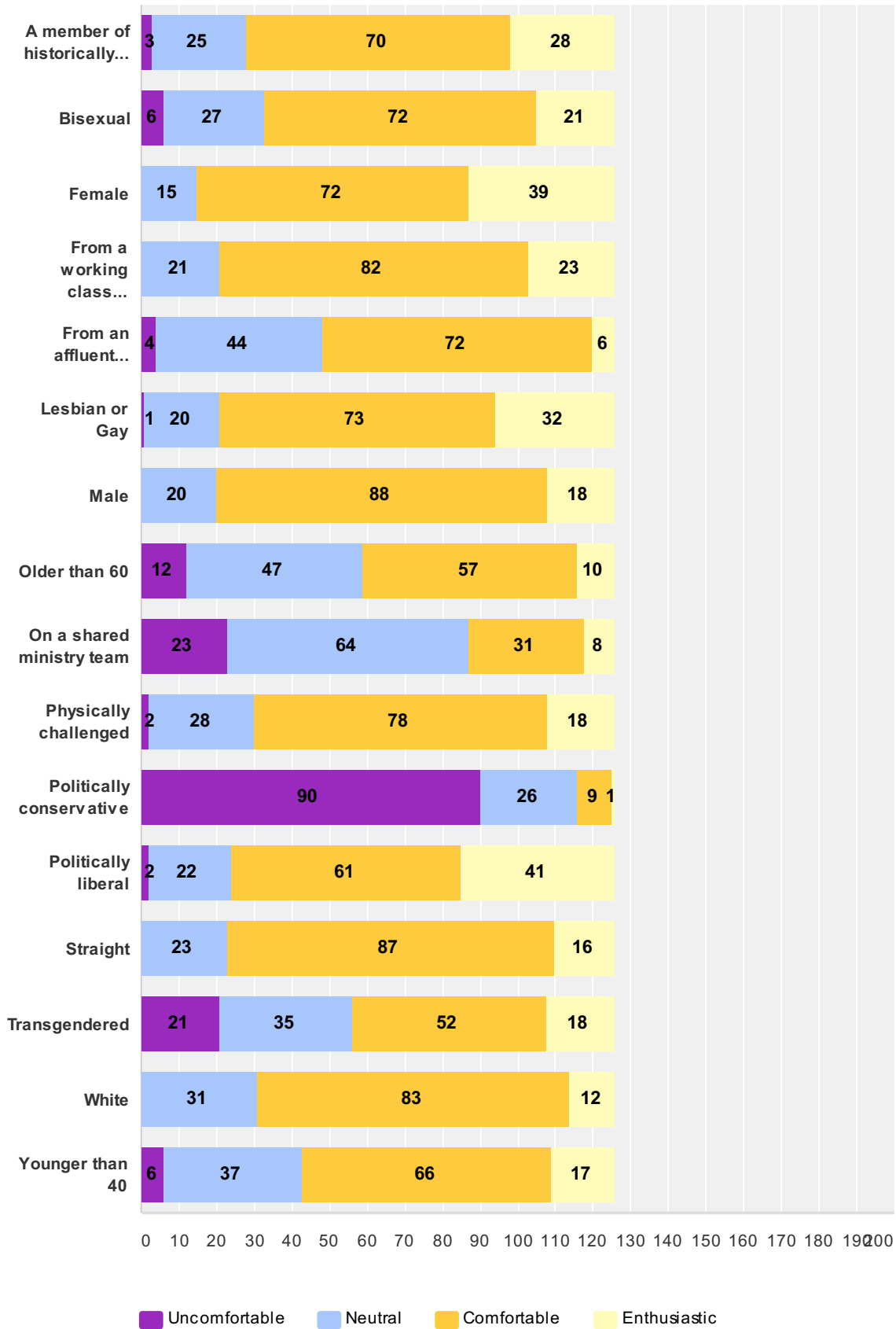

person who is:**

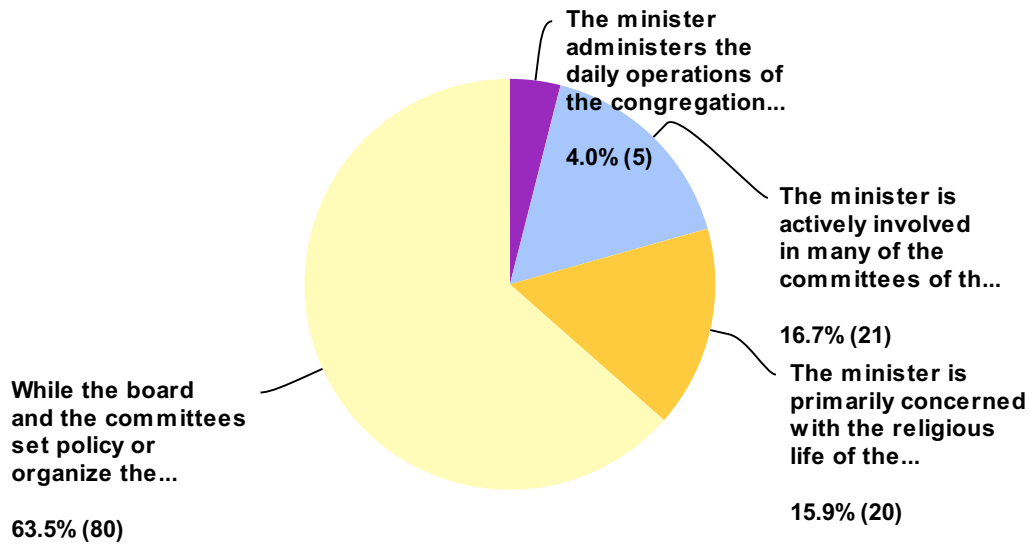

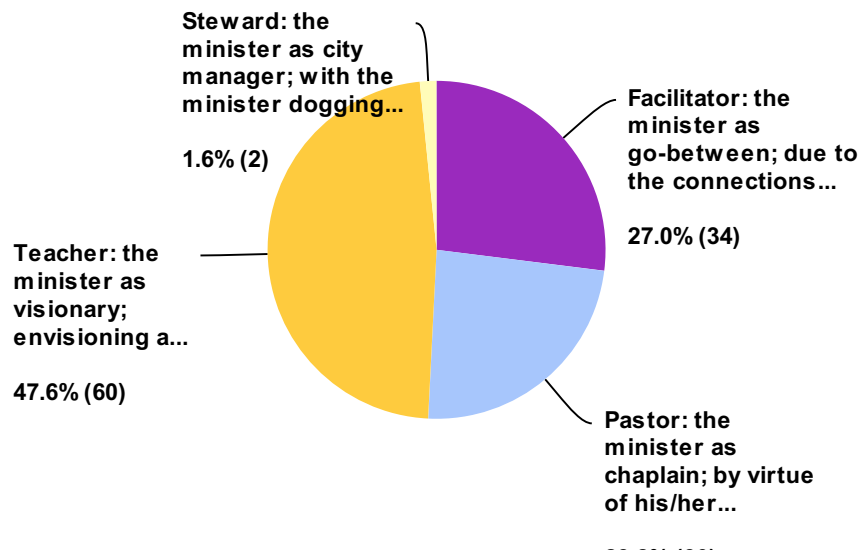
### Q43 Which statement best describes the settled minister's administrative role?

### Q44 What predominant style of ministry would you prefer in our settled minister?

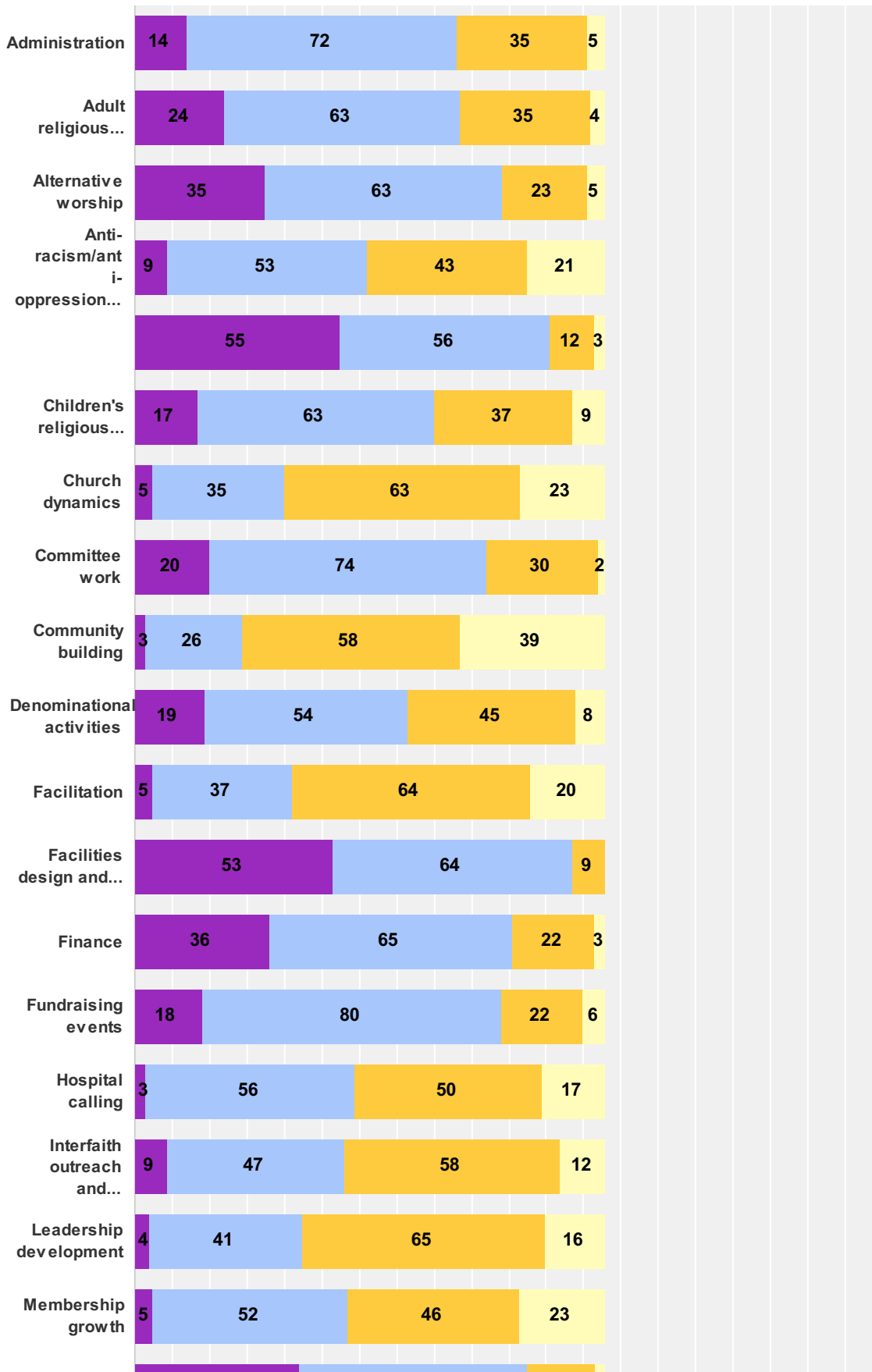

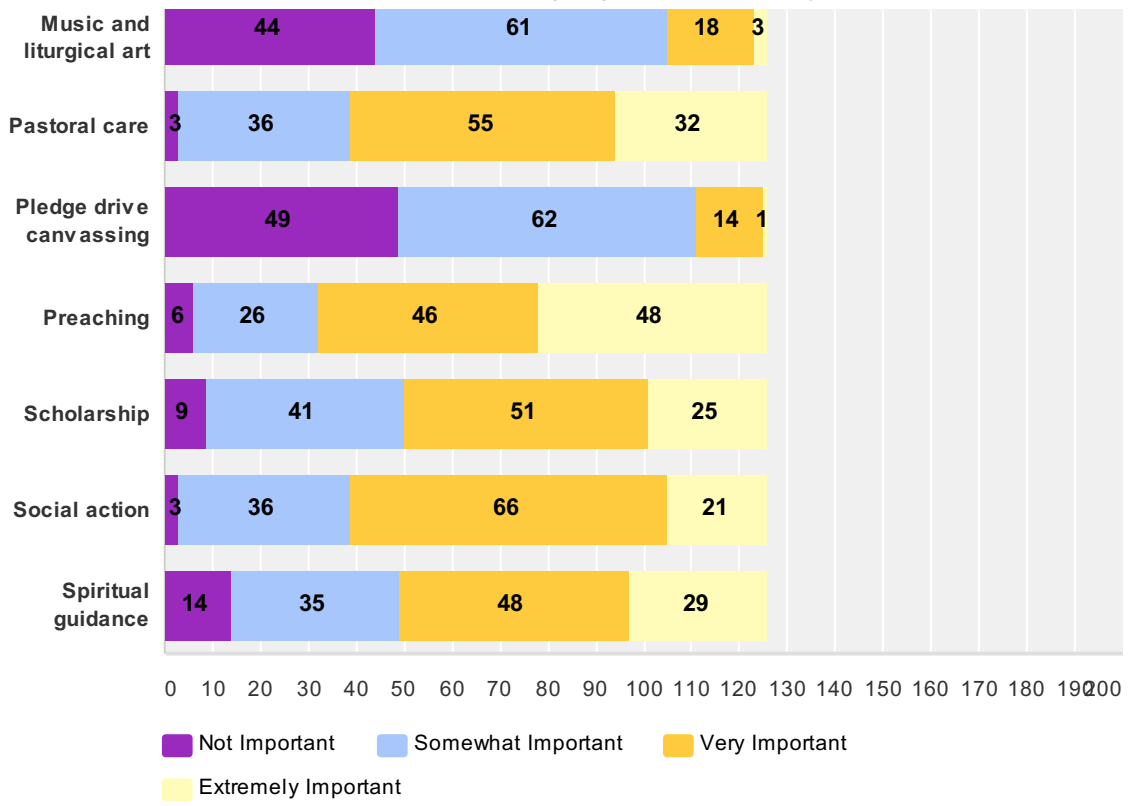


### Q45 How important to you are each of these ministerial functions?

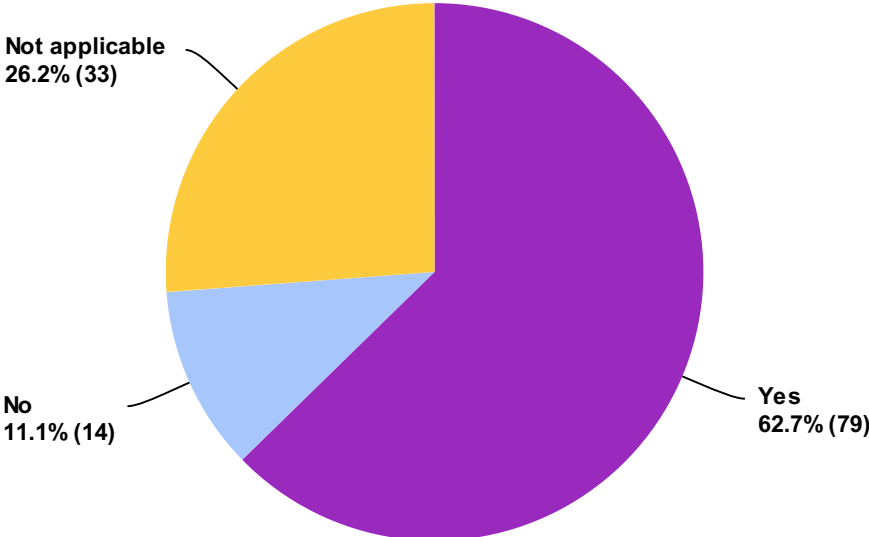
### Q53 What is your current marital status?

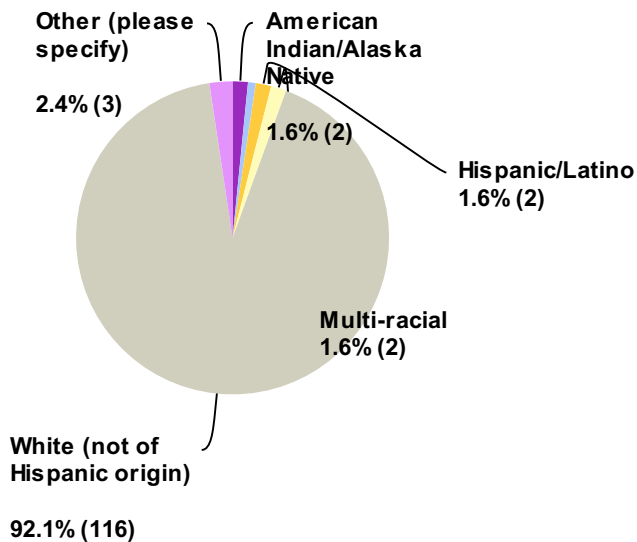
**Q54 Is your spouse/partner affiliated with the congregation?**

### Q55 How do you categorize your ethnic/racial background?

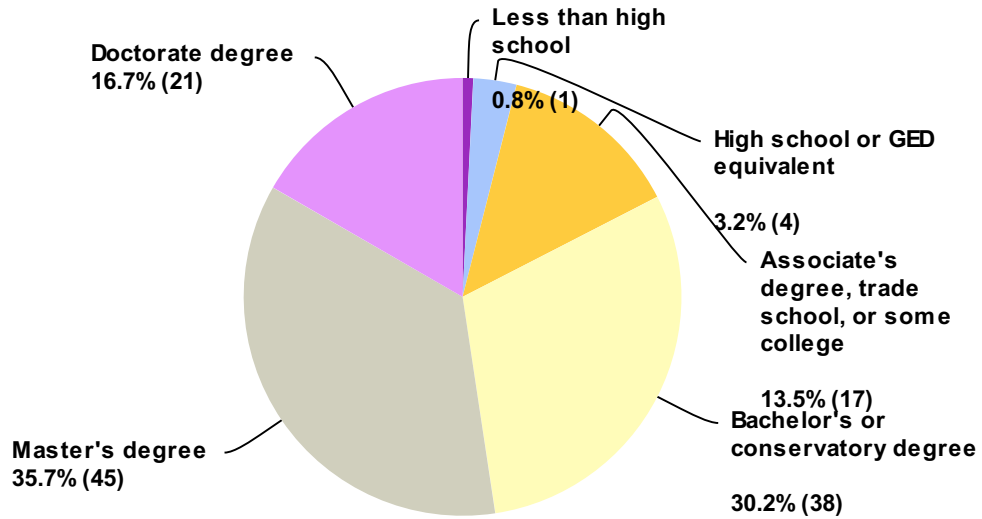

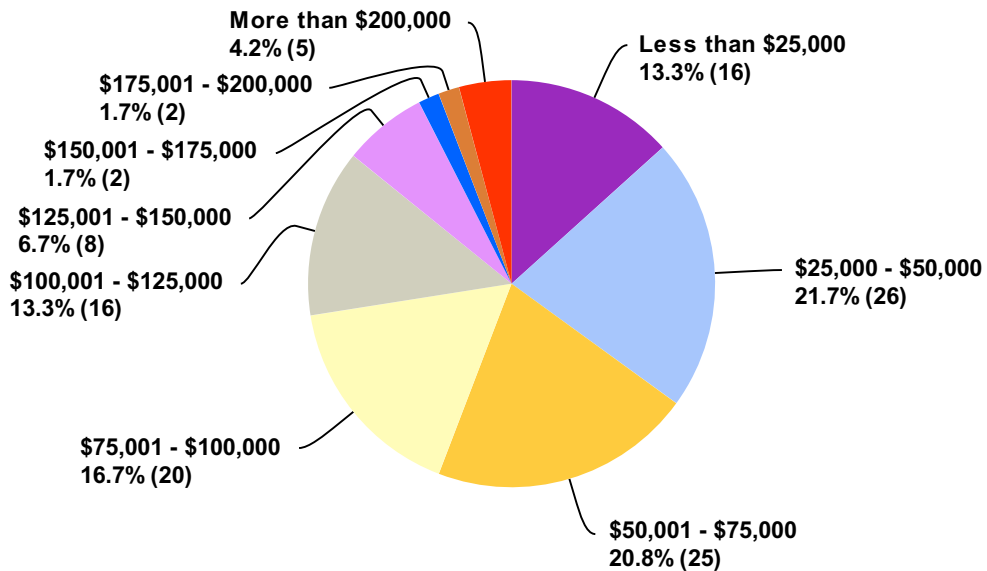
### Q56 What formal education have you completed?

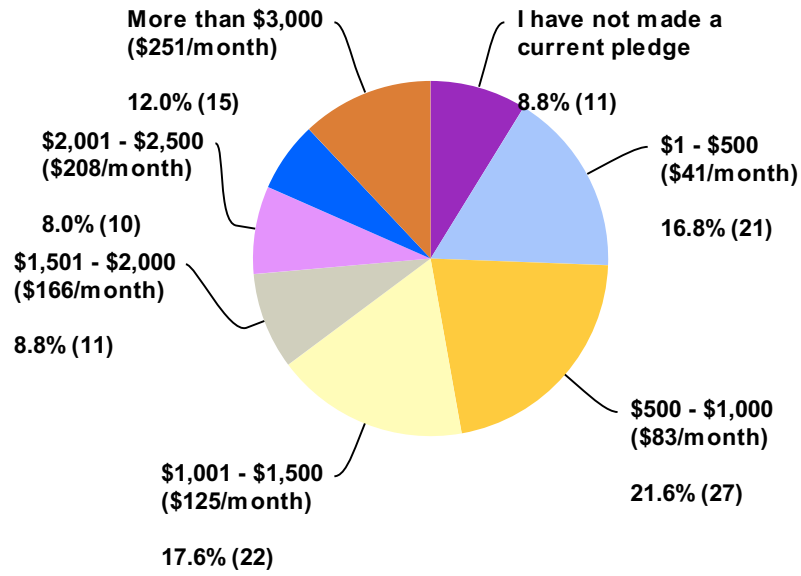
