## **Crop Walk Update**

On Sunday, November 12, Westsiders John Huffmann, Linda Hanratty, Sandy Myers, Becky Myers, and Mary Noer joined the 181 walkers in the annual Crop Walk, a program sponsored by Church World Service. Westside donations to the Crop Walk totaled \$420 and contributed toward the \$9,093 raised in total. One-fourth of the money will be distributed to the Tarrant Area Food Bank. The remaining funds will go to Church World Service to alleviate hunger and poverty in 80 countries throughout the world. Thanks to all Westsiders who participated and donated.

## **Darfur Remembered**

The Unitarian Universalist United Nations Office reminds us that escalating violence in the western part of Sudan has put the conflict in Darfur back in the headlines. The Khartoum government is again arming local militias, known as janjaweed, to help carry out its brutal counterinsurgency campaign. Congress and the Bush Administration must now work with global partners, including the European Union, the Arab League, and the African Union, along with China and Russia, to end the violence and work toward a lasting peace. The U.S. and other members of the international community need to continue to invest considerable diplomatic and financial resources in both immediate and long-term aspects of an ongoing peace process: providing human security, meeting humanitarian needs, and sustaining high-level political engagement.

## Spread the Faith

Here's a suggestion from Beverly Archibald, a fellow Westsider, about something good being done in Iraq, of which we can all be a part (from Bob Ray Sanders' column in the Fort Worth Star-Telegram of Sunday, November 12th).

Scott Baum, a fellow Texan, is a major in the Army Reserves, currently serving in Iraq. He feels strongly that more than just military might is necessary for a victory in Iraq. Scott's unit, the 3rd Iraqi Military Transition Team, has come up with something to help change the minds and hearts of the people of Iraq. From Bob Ray, "The 3rd Division has launched 'Operation School House' to collect supplies for children and teachers in Iraq... You, too, can help with the school effort by sending materials through the U.S. Postal Service and....it is simple to do.

First of all, the post office provides the free shipping box and the customs declaration form, and the maximum price for a shipment is only \$8. The standard student package, according to the division's newsletter, would include: pencils, notepads, a pencil sharpener, color markers, crayons, scissors, an eraser, glue, writing paper, construction paper and coloring book. Students could also use backpacks. The newsletter notes that teacher packets include a larger quantity of supplies such as highlighters, staplers and red pens. Warm coats for women and children are also needed, as it gets very cold in Iraq in the winter.

Such an effort, the soldiers point out, is 'a much more potent weapon against the enemy than dozens of Army patrols'. School supplies for Operation School House may be sent to:


### The 7 UU Principles
