Befriended in childhood by both Thurgood Marshall and Roy Wilkins, Rev. Johnson joined the Civil Rights Movement in 1958 after meeting Rosa Parks. He attended Southern University in Baton Rouge and subsequently joined the Freedom Ride. Later he joined the Southern Christian Leadership Conference and became the youngest member of Dr. Martin Luther King's original staff of the SCLC. While standing up for social justice, he was arrested more than 100 times, beaten 14 times and hospitalized six times. He continues his commitment to non-violence and civil rights with the Institute of Non-Violence in Dallas.

Stewardship, the Joy of Giving




## Westside Board Adopts Communication Policy

The new church directory was recently compiled by Myrtle McMahan and distributed by Gino Kennedy. On February 16<sup>th</sup>, the Board of Directors adopted a "Communication and Privacy Policy" which restricts members' use of this contact information. Specifically it prohibits use of contacts for partisan political activities unless the UUA or the congregation of Westside UU Church has endorsed such activities. According to the policy, "the person utilizing said information should keep in mind that the person receiving their communication may hold differing religious, political or personal views and should be respectful of that diversity of opinion."

The contact information may be used to distribute information about church events and activities, important events in the lives of members and friends, activities of other UU churches, and regional or national UU activities. Users of the contact information are always encouraged to consider whether their intentions are consistent with the Seven UU Principles.

The policy is intended to provide guidelines for all official publications of the church. Anyone who is unsure whether use of contact information is appropriate should contact a Board member, committee chair, or Dr. Elleven for clarification.

Iris met her husband-to-be at a party for a mutual friend, but both were too shy to talk to each other, and they eventually got together over the adoption of a kitten! They presently own two cats, Aristotle and Archimedes. She and Larry, who is an engineer at Lockheed, will celebrate their second wedding anniversary in April.

Many of us have enjoyed hearing Iris sing in church. She started taking lessons in middle school, and has had various teachers who have trained her in opera, folk, musical theater and classical music. She is now taking private lessons and singing in a choir at TCCC.

Besides music, Iris is also interested in writing short stories and plays. She has had two plays produced, one in high school and the other in college.
