Forum



Highlights from the March 20 Board Meeting

DRE, Andrea Petty will attend General Assembly as a delegate from Westside. The Board appointed James Finn as our second delegate and agreed to pay his registration fee of \$330 out of Leadership Development.

We will negotiate a new lease with AMS soon. The Finance Committee plans to offer a multi-year (3) lease with 6 months notice by either party to terminate.

We added worker's comp to our insurance which will increase the premium by \$1,358.

The Finance Committee will amend the Financial Matters policy to include holding three months' operating expenses in reserve.

At the recommendation of the Finance Committee, we postponed the appointment of a Membership & Volunteer Coordinator Search Committee until after the Stewardship Campaign is completed in May.

Caroline appointed Andrea Petty, Gene McKeon, Dianne Nixon, Alex Blanton, Susan Farris, James Finn and herself to research the problem of the classroom dividers and come back to the Board with a proposal.

We set the date for the Congregational Meeting, June 9, at 1:30. We had hoped to have the food truck again but it is not available. We are pursuing other options for lunch. The agenda will include:

A NEW CSA IN TOWN

Carl Romano and Maria Schmidt are letting Westside in on this opportunity. An acquaintance of theirs is starting a CSA (Community Supported Agriculture). A CSA is an organization that provides a way to get local, non-corporate, sustainably produced, fresh and delicious food on your table and support the folks who farm this way.

The way these things work, usually, is people subscribe for a period, like eight weeks, and receive a box of groceries each week, which is delivered to a pick-up point.

Jacqueline Goodson is the farmer, and you can view her website at www.firstearthfarm.com. First Earth Farm will have a CSA pick-up point at the Southside Urban Market (southsideurbanmarket.com), and it will also have a farmstand so that non-CSA subscribers can purchase produce.

There will also be free range eggs and cut flowers. First Earth Farm will be at the Southside Urban Market in Fort Worth every Saturday from 10am to 1pm starting the first weekend of May. The market is located at 106 E. Daggett Ave, Fort Worth, corner of E. Daggett & S. Main.
